

The **ASEAN European Academic University Network (ASEA-UNINET)** is a network of universities, consisting of European and South-East Asian universities with the goal of promoting the continuous internationalization of education and research.

ASEA UNINET specifically aims to:

- encourage and facilitate cooperation between academic institutions in staff/student exchange, teaching and research activities
- promote scientific, cultural and human relationships and personal contacts
- encourage and initiate projects of mutual interest and benefit for faculties, staff and students
- assist in forming coalitions of resources for academic activities between member institutions
- facilitate contacts between universities, governmental and non-governmental organizations and economic operators engaged in projects related to education, science, technology and art in countries with member universities
- act as a forum of continuous discussions on the progress of these projects, and serving as a network of excellence providing expertise and initiatives for entities seeking European-Southeast East Asian relations in the fields mentioned above.

Initially (in 1994), this Network was comprised of 25 universities from Austria, Thailand, Indonesia and Vietnam. Starting in 1997, universities from other countries have joined the network namely: Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, the Netherlands, the Philippines, Sweden, Spain and the United Kingdom and Malaysia. Pakistan, on the other hand, has an Associated status for specific project. As of May 2007, a total of 63 universities, from 16 countries are members of the ASEA-UNINET. Among Philippine Higher Education Institutions, the University of the Philippines, is the only member of the Network.
